- Financial Report and 2024 Budget Eric Baertsch, Treasurer
 - o 2023 Results
 - Balance sheet review
 - Total offering \$45K over budget
 - Total Income \$60K over budget
 - Expenses were closer to budgeted ~\$7 over budget
 - Operating reserves will fund the budget overage
 - Only liability is the church mortgage
 - We budget \$5K to go into asset renewal to cover anything that may need to be repaired or replaced
 - Landscaping project was completed just over \$95K

2024 Budget

- We lowered the budget for giving compared to this last year's actual
- The old parsonage will not be used, so we are budgeting zero for rental income

- Interest income was budgeted for zero, so anything we receive will be extra income
- Salary did include cost of living adjustment and more hours for part time individuals to cover NaDyne's duties
- Computers will be updated this year (asset renewal account)
- Stewardship was a little higher than budgeted in 2023, so that is reflected in the 2024 budget
- ELCA Benevolence budgeted 2.5% of offering.
- Worship repairs there used to be a dedicated account for the organ. That dedicated fund does not have enough money, so we have added it to the worship expenses
- We will need to pay for utilities in the parsonage due to no renter covering the cost
- Property and liability insurance 50% increase switched to a monthly payment
- \$57K loss is budgeted for 2024 \$118K in Operations reserve (to be increased when Employee Retention Credit Comes in
- \$160K gift for Endowment fund is in a CD

Minnesota Assistance Council for Veterans (MACV) Housing for Veterans

The following are important insights about the potential sale of the north portion of Mount Calvary's property to Minnesota Assistance Council for Veterans (MACV) for development by Lennar Builders.

1) Draft Resolution

Mount Calvary Lutheran Church, Eagan, MN Resolution to Sell a Portion of Property Annual Meeting, May 19, 2024

"Be it resolved that Mount Calvary Lutheran Church, 3930 Rahn Road, Eagan, MN 55122; and its members, hereby on this date and day, Sunday, May 19, 2024, approve allowing the Church Council to negotiate the sale of approximately 2.1 acres (the north property) to Minnesota Assistance Council for Veterans (MACV) for the purpose of development by Lennar Builders for a Veterans' Village as represented in provided sketch and to negotiate an agreement for the north parking lot usage and cost-sharing arrangements for maintenance and improvements; with Mount Calvary Lutheran Church receiving a fair market price based on the appraised value of the land."

2) Property Logistics/Questions

- MACV will own and manage the property.
- The Community Garden remains in place on City of Eagan property and managed by the Open Door.
- Property lines will be 15 feet to the north of the driveway and 10 feet west of the northern parking lot. This preserves the walnut trees lining the driveway and the lighting near the north parking lot.
- The parking lot is not being sold.
- Access to the ravine remains intact within the revised property lines.

3) Veterans' Village

- Veterans' Village is permanent housing and not a shelter
- Veterans' Village is for single males, single females, and families
- Veterans' Village is not female only housing

4) Land Sale Process

- The project needs approval from the Metropolitan Council and City of Eagan.
- The motion solely focuses on the potential project with MACV and Lennar. If this project is not approved, there is not a backup option currently.
- An approval of the motion empowers the Church Council to negotiate and sell a portion of the property for the MACV project.
- If approved, the sale could happen as early as fall 2024, with development slated for 2025.

5) What will the proceeds of the sale be used for?

- The Church Council intends to use the proceeds from this land sale to eliminate our church mortgage.
- As of March 2024, the mortgage stood at \$308,216.81 with monthly payments of \$2560.20 and an annual total of \$30,722.40.
- Clearing this debt allows funds to be used for staffing, ministry, and congregational creativity!

6) Financial Risk of Deferred Maintenance on Alano House and Parsonage

- Both the Alano House and Parsonage require significant deferred maintenance, which will ultimately prove to be costly.
- The current zoning of the property restricts potential uses of the buildings.
- The Alano House specifically needs foundation work, plumbing repairs, and a new roof in the near future.
- The financial strain of maintaining and repairing these buildings exceeds the current capacity of the Asset Renewal Account.

Summer Pop Up Community Events: We gathered small groups of folks for various community building activities led by members of the congregation- live music at Eagan Marketfest, Beer Choir, campfire, canoe day trip with Camp Amnicon, and supported some of our students Eagan Community Theater's "Wizard of Oz." It was a fun way to gather different groups of people to connect with each other over interests and faith.

Cooking - with Karen Dare

Our Wednesday Night Suppers continued to be a highlight of our midweek programming this year, drawing an average of 100 attendees per week, with some gatherings seeing as many as 120 people. We're grateful for the support of both new and long-term volunteers in the kitchen, whose dedication is integral to the success of the program. To adapt to the increasing cost of food, we modestly adjusted the prices at the start of the year. Additionally, we introduced the option to pay with credit cards, alongside cash payments. Throughout the year, our focus remained on providing a diverse selection of homemade, nutritious meals that catered to the tastes and dietary needs of all age groups.

Information Technology

- In response to issues with the livestream cutting out during worship, we transitioned to a
 new internet service provider. Though this change didn't result in cost savings, it
 significantly enhanced the internet service stability.
- To meet evolving needs, we acquired and implemented two new computers. Furthermore, we updated the Sanctuary PowerPoint computer by repurposing a previous office computer with a newer model.
- We are currently in conversations with our sound and lighting company, as well as an electrician, to explore more efficient and effective lighting solutions for the Sanctuary.
- We've expanded wifi coverage by deploying a new wifi access point in the main entryway, ensuring faster and stronger connections for more users. This initiative also enabled us to enhance wifi coverage in other areas of the church. Improved wifi supports a growing network of devices, facilitating remote monitoring of systems like heating, cooling, and plumbing.
- In response to outdated equipment, we upgraded our security system to a cloud-based solution, providing easier user management and remote access. This system is also adaptable to support future security enhancements.
- Additionally, we installed a new TV monitor in the Gathering Space, showcasing upcoming events and images of past church gatherings. The main entryway monitor was similarly modified to display relevant information.

Faith Formation Coordinator

Faith formation at Mount Calvary continues to abound with energy as we wrap up another year together!

In July & August 2023, we brought back our All-Ages Outdoor Vacation Bible School for a third year. 50 members ranging in age from infants to grandparents shared meals together, sang camp songs, and learned some of the animal stories in the Bible. These days are so full of life and energy and relationships - all the things that make Mount Calvary special. None of this would be possible without Kim Thole, who plans every detail months in advance. Thank you, also, to David Prowant, Karen Dare, and their team of volunteers for preparing dinner for us each night. Mark your calendars now for our 4th annual All-Ages Vacation Bible School (July 8-11, 2024)!

We brought back our Early Childhood programs last fall, including Infant/Toddler Sunday School and God's Children Sing. Both of these programs, along with Praise Choir and preschool/kindergarten Sunday School, meet in the newly-converted Early Childhood Room (in the former B1-B3 space), a space designed specifically for our youngest members with toys, child-sized furniture, and a circle-time rug. If you haven't already ventured down there this year, feel free to come check it out!

Sunday mornings are a time for our preschool through fifth grade students to experience bible stories with their whole bodies! Our Sunday School program served 36 students this year as we journeyed through the Old Testament and the gospels. Some highlights included a thumb wrestling tournament (Jacob Wrestles with God), using slingshots (David & Goliath), building with plastic cups (House on the Rock), and wrapping each other in toilet paper (Lazarus). We had many volunteers give their time and talents this year, but we are particularly grateful to our core team of teachers - Kim Thole, Susan Olsen, Michelle Finlon, Grace Newton, Lydia Jones, and Alexis Jones.

In July 2024, we will be bringing 22 Mount Calvary children and youth to Luther Crest Bible Camp in Alexandria, MN. For eight of these students, this trip will be their first experience at Luther Crest; the other 14 will be returning to their home-away-from-home. With your support and encouragement, our kids and families have embraced summer outdoor ministry as an essential part of their faith life.

Children, youth, and families remain a core part of what we do here at Mount Calvary, as they were when I arrived as a middle-schooler 26 years ago. I look forward to what the next year will bring!

Message from Music Ministry Staff

Music ministry at Mount Calvary continues to thrive because of all of you. We had 50 people registered to participate in our vocal choirs, bell choirs, and music classes this year, and these folks showed up every week to share their gifts and make music in community with one another.

Wendi Alexander continued in her role as Children's Choir director, meeting weekly with our 1st through 5th grade musicians. Highlights included "The Friendly Beasts" mini-program at Christmastime and a spectacular spring musical (which Wendi wrote herself!).

Liz Lindner directed both Rings of the Lord (bell choir) and Praise Choir (preschool singers) this year. The bell choir continued to expand as the year went on, to the point that there were almost more ringers than bells. The preschoolers and kindergartners in the Praise Choir danced a lot, continued to learn more American Sign Language, and shared their gifts with the congregation in December and April.

Sam Ryden joined us this year as Music Intern, leading us in worship with his guitar and remarkable vocal talents.

Alanna Teragawa is in her 22nd year directing the Calvary Carillons handbell choir, where many of the ringers have rung that long or longer as well. Many of the ringers, including Alanna, have been ringing since 1985 (39 years!!) when the bells were first purchased. Two new ringers joined the ensemble this year and have learned how much fun ringing and socializing is in this group. These two had never rung a bell before but they quickly learned, with help from the existing ringers. The Calvary Carillons are always looking for more ringers. Did you know that there are over 20 bells that can't be used because there aren't enough ringers? All adults are welcome to give it a try. It is very helpful if you know how to read music. The ringers continued to meet weekly and perform monthly throughout the year and look forward to a trip to La Crosse, Wisconsin, in June for the Handbell Musicians of America bi-annual convention.

Each ensemble at Mount Calvary is very welcoming. All are encouraged to talk to one of the leaders above to find out just how quickly and easily it is to "give it a try". You do not have to be a member of Mount Calvary to join in the fun. Bring a neighbor!
